Along Angioy str., we get to **Sebastiano Satta Square**, by Costantino Nivola, a sculptor from Orani, of whom you can admire the many small statues on the



rocks.

From Satta Square we arrive at **Su Connottu Square**, which is named after the revolutionary motto of 26<sup>th</sup> April of 1868, after the application of the “Edict of Chiudende” an agrarian reform of 1820.



Walking along Su Connottu Str., we get in front of San Carlo's Church where is placed Francesco Ciusa's tomb and a copy of “La madre dell'ucciso” one of his most famous statues..

Our next step is **Salvatore Satta Square** in front of which we find **Grazia Deledda's House**, first female Italian winner of the Nobel prize for literature. We'll have a guided visit inside.

Out of the house we'll walk along Grazia



Deledda Str., as far as the crossroads and straight on to “**Santa Maria Della Neve**” **Cathedral**, after which the square is named.

To the left of the church, the **Museum Francesco Ciusa "Space Tribu"** hosts the most comprehensive exhibition of works by the artist, together with temporary exhibitions of photography, painting, crafts, workshops and other cultural events.

Along Sant'Onofrio Str. and Antonio Mereu Str. we arrive to the last stop of



our itinerary: **Museum of Life and of Sardinian Folk Traditions**, better known as **Ethnographic Museum or Museum of the Costumes**, which collects costumes and typical objects of the Sardinian life and handicrafts.

All aspects of the Sardinian culture (costumes, jewels, textile and wooden handicrafts, bread, musical instruments of folk music and households and work tools etc.) are represented in this Museum Particular attention is given to popular religious events, festivals, etc.
